Dear Governor Hochul,

We the undersigned 242 organizations represent hundreds of thousands of New Yorkers who want to live in a state where their health, economic well-being, and future are prioritized and protected. We write to express our frustration with ever-rising energy costs driven by irresponsible fossil fuel infrastructure spending. We are also concerned that New York's clean energy programs - critical resources for millions of households who would benefit from affordable, clean energy - are falling behind because they are neither adequately funded nor designed to reach those who need them the most. We believe that you, like us, recognize the urgency and severity of both the climate crisis and the energy affordability crisis. We urge you, therefore, to take immediate action to protect struggling families and businesses by ending wasteful spending on fracked gas pipelines and instead make smart investments in building decarbonization.

Your upcoming State of the State address and Executive Budget present opportunities to recommit to New York's climate leadership and to fulfill the promises of our landmark Climate Law, the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA), which your state agencies rightly determined would protect the health and wellbeing of New York's residents, grow our workforce and economy, and save money. Your administration's Climate Action Council Scoping Plan outlines several necessary legislative and regulatory actions to ensure that we're safe, healthy, and comfortable in our homes, free from the burden of high bills, and proud of the world we will pass on to the next generation.

We request that you include these priorities in your 2025 policy agenda:

• Enable an affordable gas transition: We appreciate your inclusion of provisions of the NY HEAT Act in your previous Executive Budget with the Affordable Gas Transition Act. We request that you expand upon those provisions by including the full NY HEAT Act in your upcoming SFY2025-26 Executive Budget proposal and by preserving a strong bill in the enacted budget. It's past time to end the continuing expansion of the costly fracked gas pipeline network and to repeal outdated laws, such as the 100 foot rule and the statutory pro-gas mandate under Public Service law, that hold us back from neighborhood-scale building decarbonization projects. This legislation would also protect 1.4 million energy-burdened households by limiting energy bills to 6% of household income, and ensure that today's gas pipeline workers will have good-paying jobs in utility decarbonization programs.

- Fund retrofit readiness: We need your leadership to solve a longstanding problem that is barring too many New Yorkers from accessing cost-saving energy efficiency retrofits. Too many are forced to live in homes that are making them sick, exacerbating health disparities, and are ill-equipped for increasingly extreme weather. A \$200 million program in the state budget to remediate older houses and apartments of low- and moderate-income New Yorkers, readying them for weatherization and electrification, would finally begin to address a hole in existing programs and open up access to state and federal clean energy funding that is currently out of reach for many New Yorkers.
- Require gas utilities to do their part to address the climate crisis: The Department of Environmental Conservation and Department of Public Service need to comply with the requirements of the CLCPA to set and enforce specific emissions reduction targets for gas utilities and the buildings sector. Emissions from this sector are the largest source of greenhouse gases in the State. Gas utilities deliver 35% of the fossil fuels that New York consumes, and they must be required to plan and execute strategies to reduce their fair share of greenhouse gases in their service territories each year at a rate sufficient to meet the greenhouse gas emissions limits in the CLCPA.
- Fund innovative state projects to lead by example: Our campuses, facilities, and Capitol should be shining examples of New York's global leadership and commitment to addressing climate change and energy inequity. Instead, our most prominent state-owned buildings in downtown Albany are heated with fossil-fuel energy from a plant that pollutes the air of a low-income BIPOC community. Decarbonizing the State Capitol and other high-emitting state-owned facilities is an opportunity for New York to demonstrate how we can use innovation to upgrade and modernize our state buildings. We ask you to include funding for decarbonization and thermal energy networks at the Empire State Plaza and 14 of the highest-emitting state-owned campuses and facilities identified in NYPA's decarbonization action plans, and to implement this on an ambitious timeline.

We are ready to work with you to create a more sustainable, equitable, and affordable energy future for all New Yorkers. We look forward to meeting with you to discuss these priorities and answer any questions you may have.
